Fr Jonathan Cotton O.S.B. R.I.P.

Please remember in your prayers Fr Jonathan Cotton OSB, who died in the monastic infirmary at Ampleforth Abbey on the afternoon of Wednesday 17 January, after a long illness. Fr Jonathan, aged 80, had been a Monk of Ampleforth for almost 63 years and a Priest for almost 53 years, having been ordained on 4 July 1971. He served as an Assistant Priest here at St Mary's Brownedge and was a popular chaplain at the high school, later serving as Parish Priest from 1989 until 1992 before moving the short distance to St Mary's, Leyland where he was Parish Priest for 30 years, from 1992 until 2022. He continued to take a keen interest in our parish, assisting here from time to time at Advent and Lenten reconciliation services and kept in touch with parishioners, several of whom were friends of many years standing.

Another of our former Parish Priests, Fr Bede Leach OSB, remembers Fr Jonathan as follows: "In 1981 when I was sent to St Mary's, Bamber Bridge for 6 months, Fr Jonathan was the junior curate among six monks who lived there, and he was a great mentor to me in spirituality and good pastoral practice". May he rest in peace and rise in glory.

Where does authority come from? Why is one man regarded as a prophet, and another as a lunatic, and a third as a hypocrite? Jesus startles the crowds with a "new teaching" today, but what amazes them so much is not the message but the authority behind it: they are

convinced because what he does somehow adds credibility to what he says. It's the old situation that we are all familiar with - we look through words to see the actions, which show us the real message. The scribes did not heal or work miracles, but simply talked about God. Jesus talks about the Kingdom of God, but also shows the people what it is - a Kingdom where all that damages human happiness is abolished. The other side to this is that we must listen to a prophet or teacher when they are backed by such authority; we may not "harden our hearts" and ignore the message when we have recognised that the messenger is sent by God. This is the hard part, because it demands that we too show, by our actions, that we have heard.

Message from Paul Chisnall following his seminarian placement with us:

Dear friends, The time has come for me to leave the parishes at Brownedge and Lostock Hall after my short stay of three weeks. I will now return to the seminary in Birmingham, to continue my studies for one more year.

I have enjoyed spending time in this part of the diocese. I have seen disciples of Jesus who are faithful to the Church and each other. Saint John said, "God is love, and he who abides in love abides in God." I know the people here abide in God because I have seen them abiding in love.

Thank you for making me feel so welcome. I hope that one day I will return, perhaps to say Mass (God willing). Please pray for me. God bless you. With kind regards.
