TODAY: Easter Sunday RESURRECTION OF THE LORD

The Paschal Mystery; the suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus, is the single most important event in the history of human existence. And yet it is not merely an event in history; it transcends time

and space to be a real and true event in our present time and in our locality. Our celebrations over the Sacred Triduum make present the Paschal Mystery for us here and now.

Easter is the greatest feast on our calendar: We are asked to attend Mass every Sunday because of what happened on Easter Sunday: He is risen! Alleluia! Indeed this feast is so important that it is more than a day—there is an Octave of Easter this week whereby every day is Easter Day. There can be no other feasts celebrated during the days of Holy Week and Holy Week, thus when another Solemnity falls on those days it gets moved to the first available day e.g. The Annunciation occurs usually on 25th March but that was during Holy Week this year so the Solemnity of the Annunciation will be celebrated on Monday 8th April this year. As we know, the date of Easter changes each year; this is because of a decision at the Council of Nicaea in 325 that Easter Sunday will be the first Sunday after the Spring Equinox (21) March). Thus, the earliest date for Easter 22nd March and the latest would be 25th April.

Therefore Easter is not simply one feast among others, but the "Feast of feasts," the "Solemnity of solemnities," St. Athanasius calls Easter "the Great Sunday" and the Eastern Churches call Holy Week "the Great Week."

The Triduum and Easter Services - Thank you to everyone who helped to prepare the Churches and the wonderful liturgies over this Sacred Time.

Happy Easter! Fr Mark and Fr Colin would like to thank everyone for their kindness and support, Many members of our community do so much to help us all; it is much appreciated. We pray for every blessing of this sacred feast to be with each of you, your loved ones, and our whole community.

Eucharistic Ministers: Many thanks to all those who have offered to take on the role of being a Minister of the Eucharist. There will be 2 sessions of training for new Ministers on **Sat April 13th and Sat April 20th at 10.30 for about 1 hour**. This will take place in the Narthex at St Mary's Brownedge, and is for ministers from both our parishes. Also, any current ministers who would like to attend to deeper their appreciation of this ministry will be very welcome.

Commemorating Our Benedictine Heritage: Priests from The Order of St Benedict, mostly from Ampleforth Abbey, have played a huge part in serving the Catholic communities in our area for hundreds of years. This included founding the parish of St Mary's Browedege in 1780 and subsequently Our Lady and St Gerard's in 1891. We have been looking for some time to have a permanent commemoration to their work. We have commissioned marble plaques for each church which will list the names of all those monks who have served as our Parish Priests over those years. The stonemasons have indicated that in could take several months for the white marble tablets to arrive but we will provide updates on the progress and potential unveiling.



GIFT AID: New Gift Aid and non-gift aid envelopes are ready to collect from the back of Church in the Narthex. If your box is missing or details are incorrect, or you would like to start using envelopes please contact the office. Thank you to all our regular Gift Aiders for your continued support.

The label with the relic reads 'Ex oss S. Ger. Maj.' the first part being the abbreviation, in Latin, of 'Ex Ossibus' which means 'From the bone'. This means that it is a First Class Relic. Fr Mark and John Robinson gave Nicky and Gerald a brief overview of the history of the church and the background to the dedication of the church to both Our Lady of Lourdes and the Redemptorist lay brother, St Gerard Majella.
