TODAY: SS PETER & PAUL

Peter and Paul are the two great heroes of the Apostolic Age Peter for leading the first Christian communities and binding them in unity, a role that springs from his profession of faith in Caesarea Philippi, and Paul for travelling throughout the Roman Empire as the Apostle to the Gentiles, ensuring that the Gospel could be heard by all. They both ended up in Rome, the heart of the Empire, where they crowned their lives of witness by shedding their blood for Christ. As the ancient hymn for this feast day ("Decora Lux aeternitatis") says: ""Rejoice, O Rome, this day; thy walls they once did sign With princely blood, who now their glory share with thee. What city's vesture glows with crimson deep as thine? What beauty else has earth that may compare with thee?" In celebrating the death of these apostles and martyrs, we celebrate the triumph of life and death offered fully to God.

Sacrament of Confirmation: Bishop John will be celebrating the Sacrament of Confirmation for all the young people of our local parishes on Wednesday 17th July at 7pm at St Mary's **Brownedge.** Any Baptised catholic aged 13 or over is encouraged to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation to complete their initiation into the Church. The pupils at Brownedge St Mary's in Year 8 and above will all be invited to be confirmed, and Rachael, the chaplain will be doing classes of preparation over the next 2 months. Anyone else who attends another school or even an adult who perhaps never got around to being confirmed, please contact the parish office with your details and we can make arrangements to prepare you to receive this great Sacrament. Parents and grandparents, please encourage your children to join up for the Confirmation programme.

First Holy Communions: Many thanks to everyone who make the celebrations of First Holy Communion such special occasions. We had three celebrations in each parish at our Sunday Masses: this is to remind everyone of the importance of coming to Sunday Mass as part of regular lives as Catholics. The children will now have Mass all together to celebrate as a group and to recognise the continuation of their journey of faith:

New Lectionary: Many thanks for everyone who has contributed the cost of the new lectionaries. The pre— order has now been made and the book should be with us in October. In the Autumn we will run a session explaining some of the changes and we will have blessing ceremony for our new lectionaries. The new Lectionary will come into use on the **First Sunday of Advent 2024.**

Salford Diocesan Synod: On Saturday, 18 May, hundreds of Synod Members from across the diocese gathered for the latest update in our diocesan synod journey in Bolton. This included Fr Mark and our parish representatives. The day focussed around the four principal themes that emerged from the Big Listen stage of the process, which took place between October 2023 and January 2024. The four themes are: "Nurturing World", Faith in Tomorrow's Connections", "Enabling Access", and "Fostering Christ-like Care". These will be the over-arching themes which we will now move on to consider in the next stage. They are fairly easy to spot as they use the name of the Priest but the email address is incorrect e.g. this week, an email arrived to CAFOD from: Fr Mark Harold <revdfrpastor@gmail.com> This is not Fr Mark's email address and is a scam. Be aware, priests or people from the diocese will never ask you for money or personal information via an email in such a random way. If you come across any such email, please do not engage with it and simply delete it from your inbox. If you are ever unsure about an email from the parish, please call the parish office and we'd be happy to advise.

Saint of the Week: 3 July; St Thomas:

The Apostle Thomas is famous for doubting the resurrection of Jesus when his fellow apostles told him about it; but if he is the sceptical apostle, he is also the believing apostle, for having seen and touched Our Risen Lord, he made the immediate leap of faith and made his famous declaration: "My Lord and My God!". Not too much is known about Thomas's life in the early Church but here is a wellknown apocryphal document called the "Acts of Thomas" which relates his missionary journeys to Persia and India. Although the document as it stands is not historical evidence (it was written to provide evidence for certain heretical Gnostic teachings), it still bears witness to the likelihood of a tradition that Thomas did go to India. We will probably never know for certain; but the Christians of Kerala have called themselves for centuries "St Thomas Christians", and they are very proud of this strong Apostolic Tradition. Happy Feast to all those in our parish who come from Indian heritage!
