TODAY: 18TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

We continue reading from John 6: this is the aftermath of the miracle, and we see the beginnings of a misunderstanding that will develop over the next four weeks. People have seen the miracle, but not the message: they have seen the sign, but not what it points towards. The bread that was given is a sign of the Bread of Life, which is the teaching, the words and the very person of Jesus, as the revelation of the Father. His mission is to draw people back to his Father, to found a New Covenant or relationship. As the weeks go by, we will see that the people's hunger is simply for spectacle and miracle, not for the much harder teaching of living nourished by God's word and the presence of his only Son. For us, the People of the New Covenant, these passages must make us think of how we receive the Lord in the Eucharist. Are we nourished by his presence, so that all the hunger and thirst of our lives is answered by the One who is the Bread of Life?

Next Weekend: Annual Mission Appeal: Each year every parish is asked to offer the opportunity to a religious missionary order to come and speak to us about their work and to appeal for financial support. This year, Salford Diocese have been asked to allow the Society of African Missions (SMA Fathers) to make an appeal in each parish in the diocese. Our parishes will be visited by one of the SMA Fathers on the weekend of Saturday 10th and Sunday 11th August to make an appeal.

Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary: The feast of Our Lady's Assumption is on the Thursday 15th August and is a Holyday of Obligation. Our Masses on that day will be as follows:

9.30am and 4.30pm at St Mary's Brownedge; 7.30pm at Our Lady and St Gerard's.

If you are away, look up where the local church is located and remember our obligation to come together for Mass on that day (and on Sundays!)

Our Lady of Walsingham raised to the rank of "Feast": The Vatican has granted permission for Our Lady of Walsingham to be celebrated as a new Feast in the dioceses of England, starting this year on 24 September. Cardinal Arthur Roche, Prefect of the Dicastery for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments, wrote to Cardinal Vincent Nichols, president of the Bishops' Conference, in response to his request last year that the Obligatory Memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary of Walsingham be raised to the rank of Feast.
