### **TODAY: 31st SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**

Every priest, and indeed every Catholic, can sometimes find themselves in the position of being asked, "This religion of yours - what's it all about, really, when you come down to it?" Our temptation might be to go on at length, which is when we should remember this Gospel. Jesus, asked a very similar question, pins our faith down to two very simple things – love of God and love of neighbour – which together make up the foundation for everything else in our religion. The very simplicity of these two commandments is a gift, so that we can try to live them out each day of our lives. The first commandment, which is also that given by Moses in the first reading, is actually a prayer that our Jewish brothers and sisters still recite every single day. Jesus, our perfect High Priest, gives us these two commandments to be written in our heads and our hearts, to remember each day, so that we may conduct ourselves in the paths of the Kingdom of God.

Red Mission Box Meeting and Mass: The Missio Team from Salford Diocese are holding a meeting for our Deanery at St Mary's Brownedge next Saturday 9<sup>th</sup> November at 10 am followed by Mass at 12 Noon. All those who help to collect the Red Mission boxes are encouraged to attend as well as any parishioner who has a Red Box at or home or who wants to support the work of Missio. If you can't make the meeting from 10 am come to the Mass which is at 12 noon.

R.C.I.A. Learning about the Catholic Faith: Perhaps you, or someone you know, have been interested in the Catholic faith for a while but not done anything about it? Stand up for life - There is a second reading of the "Assisted Dying Bill" on 29th November. There is a lot of debate on this in the media but much of it is uninformed. The Anscombe Centre have launched a set of resources to help and encourage people to engage on this issue. The Centre now have a new 'Resources' page about assisted suicide and euthanasia and the dangers that legitimising it will cause. #### **November: Month of the Holy Souls:**

During November, the final month of the Church's year, we pray for those who have died. We begin the month with the Feast of All Saints followed by All Souls Day.

Holy Souls: Envelopes are available at the back of Church—put the names of any Holy Souls you wish to be prayed for, with a donation towards Masses for the Holy Souls. These intentions will be kept on the altar throughout November as well as the at Masses offered for the Holy Souls throughout the Year.

On Remembrance Sunday, 10th November we will remember those who have died in war and conflict.

On the weekend of 16/17th November we remember in a special way those of our parish and our families who have died in the past year:

Saturday 16th at 5.30pm at St Gerard's and Sunday 17th at 9.30am at St Mary's, we invite all those who have lost loved ones to join us at Mass and light a candle for each of them. A sign-up sheet is at the back of both churches.

New Lectionary: Our new lectionaries have arrived. These will be used from the 1st Sunday of Advent. Some people like to have their own Sunday Missal to follow Mass; St Mary's Piety Shop have some copies of the new Sunday Missal available for both our parishes @ £19.95. The New Weekday Missal will be published in the spring. We will bless our new Lectionaries at Mass on the Feast of Christ the King 23/24 November so that they are ready for use the following weekend.

"Explaining the New Lectionary": On Monday 25th November at 7pm at St Mary's Brownedge, Maria Hall will present a session helping us to understand what the Lectionary is, how the new translation compares with the old one, and how we might gain more from the proclaiming and receiving of The Word of God at Mass. This session is for parishioners from across our whole deanery. It will be especially useful for readers but helpful for all of us in praying with the scriptures.

Commemorating our Benedictine Heritage: The new plaques commemorate all those Benedictines, primarily from Ampleforth Abbey, who have served in each parish and specifically list those who have served as Rectors and Parish Priests, (including Priests-in-charge). The plaque at St Mary's, which is located on the wall of the Lady Chapel transept, covers the period 1780 - 2016, whilst at Our Lady and St Gerard's, the plaque, which is located on the South wall of the nave, covers 1891 - 2018. Any donations which people would like to make towards the cost of these plaques would be most appreciated.

## Year of Jubilee 2025:

In the Catholic Church, the concept of Jubilee or 'Holy Year' was used to declare special years for forgiveness and reconciliation. The first Jubilee was declared by Pope Boniface VIII in 1300 to mark



beginning of that century. later every 100 recommended it occurring years. Various other Popes changed the length of the interval between the observances. But Pope Saint Paul II set the present 25-year interval in the 1500s. So Holy Years are "ordinary" when they occur at regular intervals (25 years in these modern and "extraordinary" when proclaimed for a very special reason. More recently a Great Jubilee was declared in 2000 by Pope Saint John Paul II to celebrate the new millennium. That Jubilee year brought the total number of universal Jubilee years to 28 that so far had been celebrated by the Church.

The 2025 Jubilee, which has the theme of "Pilgrims of Hope" will be a year of hope and trust for a world suffering the impacts of war, the ongoing impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic and the increased threats to the climate. Intended as a time of conversion and emphasis on God's mercy and forgiveness of sins, Jubilees begin with the opening of the Holy Door in St. Peter's Basilica. Holy Doors at each of the four papal basilicas in Rome are destination points for pilgrims, who pass through seeking special graces.

Vatican II Talks: In preparation for the Jubilee Year, Pope Francis is asking Catholics to study the documents of the Second Vatican Council and to dedicate more time to prayer.
