**New Lectionary:** Our new lectionaries will be used from the 1st Sunday of Advent. We will bless our new Lectionaries at Masses this weekend so that they are ready for use the following weekend.

"Explaining the New Lectionary": On Monday 25th November at 7pm at St Mary's Brownedge, Maria Hall will present a session helping us to understand what the Lectionary is, how the new translation compares with the old one, and how we might gain more from the proclaiming and receiving of The Word of God at Mass. This session is for parishioners from across our whole deanery. It will be especially useful for readers but helpful for all of us in praying with the scriptures.

## TODAY: OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, UNIVERSAL KING

Every time we complete the cycle of the liturgical year, there is a seamless blending into the new year: so, just as this week we hear of the King who is to come, next week, we begin a New Year and the Season of Advent by more meditation on the end of time, and the One who is to come again, as he once came among us. This feast affirms that Christ is King, that he is Judge, that he is Ruler of the kings of the earth. By his own words we know that this is true, as he stands before Pilate and says, "Yes, I am a king." But his kingship is different: it is not of the same kind as earthly kings, whose empires fade and pass away. His kingship is eternal, and holy until the end of time. Through his love for us, we share in this sovereignty - this holiness - as priests and kings who "serve his God and Father". We end our year in simple, awe-filled praise of the One who is, who was, and who is to come the Almighty. Alleluia! Amen!

Commemorating our Benedictine Heritage: The new plaques commemorate all those Benedictines, primarily from Ampleforth Abbey, who have served in each parish and specifically list those who have served as Rectors and Parish Priests, (including Priests-in-charge). The plaque at St Mary's, which is located on the wall of the Lady Chapel transept, covers the period 1780 - 2016, whilst at Our Lady and St Gerard's, the plaque, which is located on the South wall of the nave, covers 1891 - 2018. Any donations which people would like to make towards the cost of these plaques would be most appreciated.

Stand up for life - There is a second reading of the "Assisted Dying Bill" on 29th November. There is a lot of debate on this in the media but much of it is uninformed. The Anscombe Centre have launched a set of resources to help and encourage people to engage on this issue. The Centre now have a new 'Resources' page about assisted suicide and euthanasia and the dangers that legitimising it will cause. ## Year of Jubilee 2025:

In the Catholic Church, the concept of Jubilee or 'Holy Year' was used to declare special years for forgiveness and reconciliation. The first Jubilee was declared by Pope Boniface VIII in 1300 to mark



beginning of that century. later recommended it 100 occurring years. Various other Popes changed the length of the interval between the observances. But Pope Saint Paul II set the present 25-year interval in the 1500s. So Holy Years are "ordinary" when they occur at regular intervals (25 years in these modern and "extraordinary" when proclaimed for a very special reason. More recently a Great Jubilee was declared in 2000 by Pope Saint John Paul II to celebrate the new millennium. That Jubilee year brought the total number of universal Jubilee years to 28 that so far had been celebrated by the Church.

The 2025 Jubilee, which has the theme of "Pilgrims of Hope" will be a year of hope and trust for a world suffering the impacts of war, the ongoing impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic and the increased threats to the climate. Intended as a time of conversion and emphasis on God's mercy and forgiveness of sins, Jubilees begin with the opening of the Holy Door in St. Peter's Basilica. Holy Doors at each of the four papal basilicas in Rome are destination points for pilgrims, who pass through seeking special graces.

Vatican II Talks: In preparation for the Jubilee Year, Pope Francis is asking Catholics to study the documents of the Second Vatican Council and to dedicate more time to prayer.
