# TODAY: 3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

After our brief excursion last week into Saint John's Gospel, we are back on track this week with Saint Luke - whom we will follow for the rest of the year. Today is about beginnings: the beginning of Jesus' public ministry. It begins with the

Word of God, in the synagogue. Jesus reads from the Old Testament, as we do every Sunday, and tells the people that it is fulfilled in him. Everything that God has said to his people, through his prophets, comes together in Jesus, the Incarnate Word of God. Today is an ideal Sunday to think about the ministry of reader - about how as readers we make present' the same fulfilment, Jesus, when we read the word of God in our Churches.

Sunday of the Word of God: The third Sunday in Ordinary Time is a day when we called to remember the importance of God's Word in Holy Scripture. A good way to pray with the bible is using the daily readings at Mass—see the link to Universalis in this bulletin or use the 10 minute daily podcast, www.pray-as-you-go.org

Caritas Sunday: This Sunday across the Diocese of Salford is Caritas Sunday. This is our Diocesan charity supporting those in need in our own area. Caritas does this in very many ways: caring for the homeless, supporting families in poverty, sending family support workers into schools, providing refuge for people living in fear of violence as well as many other ways. Some of our young people will make an appeal at our Masses this weekend and there will be a collection to support the work of Caritas. Gift Aid envelopes are now at the back of Church: if you pay tax please use the envelopes to make your donation at the end of Mass.

R.C.I.A. Learning about the Catholic Faith: Our next session in our RCIA programme is this Tuesday 28th January at 7pm at St Mary's Church. We will be looking at the parts of the Mass.



#### Year of Jubilee 2025:

In the Catholic Church, the concept of Jubilee or 'Holy Year' was used to declare special years for forgiveness and reconciliation. The first Jubilee was declared by Pope Boniface VIII in 1300 to mark the

beginning of that century. He later recommended it occurring every 100 years. Various other Popes changed the length of the interval between the observances. But Pope Saint Paul II set the present 25-year interval in the 1500s. So Holy Years are "ordinary" when they occur at regular intervals (25 years in these modern times) and "extraordinary" when they are proclaimed for a very special reason. More recently a Great Jubilee was declared in 2000 by Pope Saint John Paul II to celebrate the new millennium. That Jubilee year brought the total number of universal Jubilee years to 28 that so far had been celebrated by the Church.

The 2025 Jubilee, which has the theme of "Pilgrims of Hope" will be a year of hope and trust for a world suffering the impacts of war, the ongoing impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic and the increased threats to the climate. Intended as a time of conversion and emphasis on God's mercy and forgiveness of sins, Jubilees begin with the opening of the Holy Door in St. Peter's Basilica. Holy Doors at each of the four papal basilicas in Rome are destination points for pilgrims, who pass through seeking special graces. The Pope has added a fifth Holy Door in a prison in Rome to symbolise our liberation from the captivity of our sin.

Jubilee Visits in Salford Diocese: The Diocese have nominated six churches as places of pilgrimage in the Jubilee Year. This includes St Mary's Brownedge as a place of pilgrimage. We are asked to make people welcome to visit our church during the Holy Year and offer opportunities for prayer and devotion. It would be good to have a team of people who would be willing to help with this. There is a booklet at the back of church detailing the six churches and the idea of being pilgrims of hope in the upcoming Jubilee Year. There is also a "Jubilee Passport" produced by the diocese with some of the details about the six churches and what we can see when we visit them.

Jubilee Mascot: "Luce" is the mascot for the Jubilee. Her name is the Italian for "Light" and she, like each of us, is a Pilgrim of Hope. Last week she passed on a message for us; she asked us to do whatever Jesus tells us to do, just like Mary told the servants at the Wedding Feast of Cana.



**Jubilee Guide Book:** Alive Publishing have produced a small booklet which has a lovely explanation of the Jubilee Year including prayers and devotions. These are available at the back of Church for £1.50.
