Humble behaviour is the mark of the Christian, as it always was the mark of someone "in favour with the Lord". In the Gospel, we see Jesus watching the Pharisees: it's almost amusing to picture them shuffling for the best places, being as polite as they can about it, of course, to put themselves in a better position. How would they have reacted to his teaching? They may well have remembered the passage we read from the Old Testament, and realised that Jesus was teaching the teachers something they should know only too well but often forget to put into practice.

It was a very blessed time with so many highlights; being gathered at the General Audience with Pope Leo in St Peter's Square along with people from all around the world; walking the pilgrim way to St Peter's and entering the Holy Door; visiting the tomb of Pope Francis; the beautiful location and meals outside; amazing sunsets; great company and fellowship; and so many more special personal moments. Mass and prayers were offered for the intentions of all our parishioners.

Columban Appeal: Fr Pat O'Beirne from the Columban Fathers has written to thank everyone for their welcome and generosity to his mission appeal. The collection raised £320 at St Gerard's and £444 at St Mary's plus the gift aid which will be claimed. Many thanks once again for your wonderful generosity.

Mass Intentions: Canon Law stipulates that a Parish Priest must ensure a Sunday Mass is offered for the intentions of those in his care. Where a priest is Parish Priest of more than one parish, one Sunday Mass for all those in his care is sufficient. Thus, going forward a Mass intention for the parish will be alternated between the two churches. In effect this now means that there will be an extra Mass intention available at the weekend.

Arrowsmith Walk: A group from both St Mary's and Our Lady and St Gerard's took part in the annual Arrowsmith Walk on a very warm Bank Holiday Monday, an approximate 5 mile route following in the footsteps of local Martyr, St Edmund Arrowsmith SJ, who was martyred for his faith at Lancaster on 28 August 1628. Highlights of the walk included a visit to Arrowsmith House, Gregson Lane and the Mass Room where St Edmund celebrated his last Mass before fleeing the priest-hunters and walking across Brindle Moss, below Hoghton Tower, where St Edmund's horse faltered resulting in his capture and imprisonment in Lancaster Castle. At the end of the walk, Mass was celebrated by Fr Raphael at St Joseph's Church with refreshments in the parish room. Another highlight was being able to see a number of relics associated with St Edmund, including a vestment, two small chalices and a tiny ivory statue in a case of Our Lady holding the Child Jesus. A big thank you to the parishioners at St Joseph's, Brindle for their usual welcome and hospitality, especially at such a difficult time for the parish, and to Maria at Arrowsmith House. Year of Jubilee 2025:
Jubilee Visits in Salford Diocese: The Diocese have nominated six churches as places of pilgrimage in the Jubilee Year. This includes St Mary's Brownedge as a place of pilgrimage. We are asked to



make people welcome to visit our church during the Holy Year and offer opportunities for prayer and devotion. It would be good to have a team of people who would be willing to help with this. There is a booklet at the back of church detailing the six churches and the idea of being pilgrims of hope in the upcoming Jubilee Year. There is also a "Jubilee Passport" produced by the diocese with some of the details about the six churches and what we can see when we visit them.

Jubilee Display: Please visit our Jubilee display in Our Lady's Transept in St Mary's Church; you can see some of the anchors and prayers prepared by our children; a candle for the jubilee which will be lit on special occasions during the year. Also the jubilee passport books which detail some of things to see in the six jubilee churches in Salford diocese.

Jubilee Votive Candles: These are available from the Jubilee display stand for £2 each and are good way to help our prayer time at home or perhaps to give to someone we are praying for. Put the money into the ordinary votive candle stands.

Jubilee Mascot: "Luce" is the mascot for the Jubilee and for our Children's Liturgy Group. Her name is the Italian for "Light" and she, like each of us, is a Pilgrim of Hope. She invites us all to walk as

Pilgrims of Hope. We now have a special Luce, knitted by Clare, one of our parishioners and she joined our parish pilgrimage and came with us so see so many amazing things in Rome. Clare has put together an amazing account of the pilgrimage through the eyes of Luce and taken photos of her



in all the places we visited. This lovely book is on our Jubilee display table. Many thanks to Clare for producing such a wonderful little book!

Cafod: Our First Friday Coffee Morning will take place this Friday, 5th Sept following 9.30am Mass.

Car Parking: Please be very careful when parking at church, especially in the area at the front of the church. At a recent Sunday Mass there was a serious incident caused by a car trying to manoeuvre back and forth to get out, and a foot slipping onto the accelerator pedal. It can happen very easily. If you are blocked in, please wait until you have a very simple and clear way to exit.

Bell Ropes: The ropes which are used to ring the church bells had become frayed; we have replaced 6 of the 8 ropes. This has cost £1488. We are grateful for a further donation of £500 towards this cost. Any further contributions, to help "defray" the cost, would be most welcome.

Heating Repair: The external heating pipe which runs over the old confessionals is leaking badly, causing water damage to internal wall in the Sacred Heart Transept. Quite a long stretch of insulated piping needs to be replaced. This is an expensive job which will cost approx. £12,000. We need to get this repaired before the cold returns. If anyone is willing to donate towards this repair, and stop us being frozen in the winter, it would be much appreciated! Many thanks to four donors who have already promised £7000 between them! Fantastic generosity to support our community!

Chalice Repairs: The four identical silver chalices which we often use at Mass have become very tarnished. They have been sent to Ormsby's for regilding and hopefully will soon be returned as good as new. The repair is £180 for each of them.
