23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

This is a very difficult set of readings. The Gospel itself starts with a saying which many find hard to understand: must we really "hate" our family to be the Lord's disciple? The point is that it is relative: what are we prepared to give up for the Gospel? Are we going to try and make our own cross, or accept whatever we are given? Jesus is probably trying to discourage the crowd of sensation seekers and hangers-on who are crowding round him. He wants real disciples, who are aware of the possible cost: not like the incompetent builder, or the useless king. To be a disciple, one must be prepared to follow Jesus anywhere, whatever it might cost in possessions, family or friends. We may never understand why, but then "Who can know the intentions of God?"

It was a very blessed time with so many highlights; being gathered at the General Audience with Pope Leo in St Peter's Square along with people from all around the world; walking the pilgrim way to St Peter's and entering the Holy Door; visiting the tomb of Pope Francis; the beautiful location and meals outside; amazing sunsets; great company and fellowship; and so many more special personal moments. Mass and prayers were offered for the intentions of all our parishioners.

Mass Intentions: Canon Law stipulates that a Parish Priest must ensure a Sunday Mass is offered for the intentions of those in his care. Where a priest is Parish Priest of more than one parish, one Sunday Mass for all those in his care is sufficient. Thus, going forward a Mass intention for the parish will be alternated between the two churches. In effect this now means that there will be an extra Mass intention available at the weekend.

Righting a Wrong: We have been asked to share the following message from the Northern Ireland Assembly: Politicians in Northern Ireland are working to make reparations for conditions imposed upon young women in mother and baby institutions, Magdalene laundries, and workhouses between 1922 – 1995. Bl. Carlo Acutis & Bl. Pier Giorgio Frassatti to be canonised on Sunday in Rome:

About Carlo: Born and baptised in London in 1991 to Italian parents, and they relocated to Milan a few months later. Carlo displayed deep Catholic faith, especially a love for the Eucharist—and he was a whiz with code. At just 11–12 years old, he created a website cataloguing Eucharistic miracles and Marian apparitions.

Often called "God's influencer," a millennial who loved gaming, Nutella and God and is recognized as the first millennial saint. Though raised by non-devout parents, Carlo's faith was contagious for his peers and adults, including his parents. Tragically, he was diagnosed with leukemia in October 2006 and died just days later on October 12, aged 15.

Two official miracles attributed to Carlo's intercession paved his journey to sainthood: healing a child in Brazil and a Costa Rican woman recovering from brain trauma after visiting his tomb. He was beatified by Pope Francis on October 10, 2020, in Assisi. He will be canonised on September 7, 2025, alongside Pier Giorgio Frassati. This will be Pope Leo XIV's first canonization ceremony.

Carlo's remains lie in a glass tomb at the Church of Santa Maria Maggiore in Assisi. Pilgrims, especially young people, visit in droves, sometimes virtually, drawn to this witness.

Why Carlo Acutis Matters Today: Bridging tech and faith: Carlo exemplifies how digital tools can serve lasting spiritual purposes. His love for the Eucharist resonates deeply with the young searching for authenticity. A modern saint for modern times: His life story speaks powerfully to a generation fluent in screens but searching for meaning. Ora pro nobis!

Year of Jubilee 2025:
Jubilee Visits in Salford
Diocese: The Diocese have
nominated six churches as
places of pilgrimage in the
Jubilee Year. This includes St
Mary's Brownedge as a place
of pilgrimage. We are asked to



make people welcome to visit our church during the Holy Year and offer opportunities for prayer and devotion. It would be good to have a team of people who would be willing to help with this. There is a booklet at the back of church detailing the six churches and the idea of being pilgrims of hope in the upcoming Jubilee Year. There is also a "Jubilee Passport" produced by the diocese with some of the details about the six churches and what we can see when we visit them.

Jubilee Display: Please visit our Jubilee display in Our Lady's Transept in St Mary's Church; you can see some of the anchors and prayers prepared by our children; a candle for the jubilee which will be lit on special occasions during the year. Also the jubilee passport books which detail some of things to see in the six jubilee churches in Salford diocese.

Jubilee Votive Candles: These are available from the Jubilee display stand for £2 each and are good way to help our prayer time at home or perhaps to give to someone we are praying for. Put the money into the ordinary votive candle stands.

Jubilee Mascot: "Luce" is the mascot for the Jubilee and for our Children's Liturgy Group. Her name is the Italian for "Light" and she, like each of us, is a Pilgrim of Hope. She invites us all to walk as

Pilgrims of Hope. We now have a special Luce, knitted by Clare, one of our parishioners and she joined our parish pilgrimage and came with us so see so many amazing things in Rome. Clare has put together a fantastic account of the pilgrimage through the eyes of Luce and taken photos of her



in all the places we visited. This lovely book is on our Jubilee display table. Many thanks to Clare for producing such a wonderful little book!

Jubilee Church Guide: Thanks to David Gorman who has produced a short guide to St Mary's Church for visiting pilgrims. Also, Fr Mark has left copies of the prayers which pilgrims use when they go through the Holy Door of St Peter's. We can use them here when visiting the church.

Bell Ringing - There will be a Bell Ringers meeting and Bell Ringing practice on 13th and 14th September.

Bell Ropes: The ropes which are used to ring the church bells had become frayed; we have replaced 6 of the 8 ropes. This has cost £1488. We are grateful for a further donation of £500 towards this cost. Any further contributions, to help "defray" the cost, would be most welcome.

Chalice Repairs: The four identical silver chalices which we often use at Mass have become very tarnished. They have been sent to Ormsby's for regilding and hopefully will soon be returned as good as new. The repair is £180 for each of them. Thank you for the kind donation to pay for one of them.

Heating Repair: The external heating pipe which runs over the old confessionals is leaking badly, causing water damage to internal wall in the Sacred Heart Transept. Quite a long stretch of insulated piping needs to be replaced. This is an expensive job which will cost approx. £12,000. We need to get this repaired before the cold returns. If anyone is willing to donate towards this repair, and stop us being frozen in the winter, it would be much appreciated! Many thanks to four donors who have already promised £7000 between them! Fantastic generosity to support our community!

Car Parking: Please be very careful when parking at church, especially in the area at the front of the church. At a recent Sunday Mass there was a serious incident caused by a car trying to manoeuvre back and forth to get out, and a foot slipping onto the accelerator pedal. It can happen very easily. If you are blocked in, please wait until you have a very simple and clear way to exit.
