Our Lady of Walsingham to be celebrated as a Feast Day in the dioceses of England, on 24th September.

The Shrine of Our Lady of Walsingham was established in 1061, according to the text of the Pvnson Ballad, when devout noblewoman Richeldis de Faverches asked in prayer for inspiration so that she could carry out a special work in honour of Our Lady. The Pynson Ballad says that Our Lady appeared to Richeldis and showed her in spirit the House of the Annunciation where the Angel greeted Mary in Nazareth, and asked her to build a replica in Walsingham perpetual memorial of the Annunciation

This Shrine, which was once the focus of Pilgrimage in a land called 'Our Lady's Dowry', is now restored to the prominence it enjoyed for so long.

War Memorials - What War memorials?

Chatting to an old work colleague (Leyland Motors Ltd) in Leyland recently, our chat about the good old days went on to the subject of War Memorials. He said that Lostock Hall did well having Three War Memorials. I quickly corrected him and informed him that Lostock Hall and Tardy Gate had Seven if we included nearby St Pauls CE Church in Farington. "Tell me what you know about the three I mentioned he said," and then I'll look forward to you filling me in about the other four.

The village War Memorial (Cenotaph) was incorrectly recorded as being erected in 1921 when in actual fact it was December 1924. Sadly, despite informing the local branch of the Royal British Legion in Lostock Hall several times about the centenary last December (2024) there was no ceremony to honour and remember this historic event. Nice murals though!

The cenotaph began life close to the 111 Bus Stop at the junction of Croston Road and Watkin Lane before pedestrianisation took place in the 1980's and Hope Terrace became traffic free. The memorial was moved to its present position.

The memorial on Brownedge Road close to the traffic lights appeared in circa 2012 after removal from the Methodist Church on Watkin Lane, when the church closed and was then converted into business premises.

The imposing Memorial in 'Dandy Brook Park' on the corner of Lostock Lane and next to the huge roundabout was unveiled in November 2015.

"Three down and four to go" was the cry from my attentive ex workmate so on I went.

Tardy St Gerards RC Church War Memorial which now stands in the graveyard was placed there at the end of 1962 and beginning of 1963 to pave the way to the church extension in 1963.

St James CE church on Moss Lane boasts its own War Memorial plaque further down from the church entrance.

St Pauls CE on Church Lane, Farington has a similar type, memorial inside the church entrance.

Finally, to complete "The Magnificent Seven", a memorial plaque/stone was erected, according to the bottom line on the memorial in November 1990 to remember those killed by a German Bomber in October 1940. However it was erected just off Watkin Lane on the left hand side of Ward Street affront a rest home, when the actual bomb site was some 200-300 metres further up Ward Street close to the original canteen and dance hall for the nearby Thomas Moss and Sons Cotton Mill and Batley Shoe Factory etc.

So in a village renowned for its many hairdressers, barbers and takeaways, we can boast Seven memorials to the fallen.

- September 8 Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Celebrates the birth of Mary, the Mother of Jesus. A joyful Marian feast.
- September 14 Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. Commemorates the discovery of the True Cross by St. Helena and the redemptive power of Christ's crucifixion.
- September 15 Our Lady of Sorrows. Honours the suffering of Mary during the Passion of Christ.
- September 21 Feast of St. Matthew, Apostle and Evangelist Celebrates the calling and witness of the tax collector-turned-apostle.
 - September 29 Feast of Saints Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael (Archangels)

Historical Events in September

- September 14, 335 Dedication of the Church of the Holy Sepulchre. The Church built over the traditional site of Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection in Jerusalem was consecrated by Emperor Constantine's mother, St. Helena.
- September 13, 122 Pope St. Hyginus elected. While not well documented, his papacy began around this time and was marked by early theological challenges like Gnosticism.
- September 13, 122 Death of Pope St. John Chrysostom (407) Archbishop of Constantinople, known for his eloquent preaching ("Golden Mouth") and for standing up to imperial authority.
- September 30, 420 Death of St. Jerome. The Church Father best known for translating the Bible into Latin (the Vulgate), which became the standard text for the Church for centuries.
- September 3, 2000 Beatification of Pope Pius IX and Pope John XXIII by Pope John Paul II. This brought attention to two very different popes: Pius IX, known for the First Vatican Council, and John XXIII, known for convening the Second Vatican Council

Interesting Facts

. The Ancient Greeks used vending machines.
Around 1st century BCE, Hero of Alexandria invented a device that dispensed holy water when a coin was inserted. It worked via a system of levers and counterweights — like a primitive soda machine at a temple.

The Mayans had a concept of zero before most of the world. While Europe struggled without zero until about the 12th century, the Maya were using it as early as 4th century CE, represented by a shell-like glyph. It was critical to their complex calendar systems.

The Great Pyramid was originally white and shiny. It was once covered in smooth, white Tura limestone, polished to reflect sunlight and glow like a "gem" in the desert. Earthquakes and looters removed the casing stones, revealing the rough core we see today.

The Babylonians tracked Jupiter with surprising accuracy. Using clay tablets from 350 BCE, they calculated the area under a curve (a technique similar to integral calculus) to predict the movement of Jupiter — a level of astronomy not seen again for nearly 2,000 years.

The Library of Alexandria wasn't destroyed in one day — it faded over centuries. Contrary to the myth of a single catastrophic fire, historians believe the library declined gradually due to multiple fires, neglect, and political turmoil over several hundred years.

No single villain — just erosion over time.

Dog Fouling in Our Church Grave Yard

Our grave yard is a place of peace, remembrance, and reflection. It holds deep meaning for many families who visit the resting places of their loved ones. Unfortunately, a growing concern is threatening the dignity of this sacred spaces: dog fouling.

In recent weeks, our maintenance team have reported instances of dog mess being left in the grave yard. This not only disrespects the memory of those buried there but also creates a health hazard and an unpleasant experience for those attending services or visiting graves.

While we understand that many dog owners are responsible and caring, it only takes a few careless individuals to cause significant upset. The grave yard is not a dog park—it is hallowed ground. Allowing dogs to foul here, and failing to clean up after them, is deeply disrespectful.

We kindly ask all dog owners to:

- Keep dogs on a lead when near or in the grave yard.
- Always carry waste bags and clean up after your pet.
- Avoid using the grave yard as a regular walking route if possible.

We are adding signage as a reminder and there is a bin for dog waste on Brownedge Road near the crossing.
