Walking with the Saints in Eastertide - Continued

In the heart of Eastertide, the Church walks slowly, allowing the joy of the Resurrection to sink into ordinary life. The saints of May teach us that risen life takes shape through fidelity, courage, repentance, and love—often quietly, sometimes at great cost.

As summer unfolds and the light of the days lengthens, June invites us to continue walking faithfully with Christ through Ordinary Time. The saints who accompany us this month show us that holiness is lived out not in extraordinary circumstances alone, but in daily faithfulness, courage, and love.

We begin June with St Justin (1 June), an early Christian thinker who believed deeply that faith and reason belong together. Walking with Justin reminds us that our faith is something to be understood, cherished, and shared thoughtfully with the world around us.

On 2 June, we remember St Marcellinus, a priest and martyr whose quiet faithfulness under persecution speaks of trust and perseverance. His witness encourages us to remain steadfast, even when discipleship is unnoticed or difficult.

Early in the month we also walk with St Charles Lwanga and Companions (3 June), whose courage and fidelity in the face of violence and fear remind us that faith is not only something we believe privately, but something we live openly, rooted in love and truth.

We then meet St Boniface (5 June), a saint closely connected with the English Church. Boniface's life was marked by mission, courage, and a willingness to follow God's call into unfamiliar territory. Walking with Boniface invites us to see our own parishes, homes, and workplaces as places where the Gospel can quietly take root.

On 11 June, we honour St Barnabas, whose name means "son of encouragement". Barnabas reminds us of the importance of kindness, patience, and generosity of spirit. Walking with him calls us to support one another, to recognise the gifts of others, and to build up the Body of Christ through encouragement and trust.

Later in June we commemorate Sts John Fisher and Thomas More (22 June), men of conscience and integrity who remained faithful to truth despite great personal cost. Their witness speaks powerfully to our own times, encouraging us to hold fast to faith and moral courage with humility and charity.

Also close to our own local history is St John Southworth (26 June), a priest and martyr of England whose ministry was carried out quietly and courageously among ordinary people. Walking with John Southworth invites us to see holiness in faithful service, especially hidden service offered with love.

On 27 June, we remember St Cyril of Alexandria, a defender of the faith and a teacher of the Church, whose life reminds us of the importance of holding fast to the truth of Christ with clarity and devotion.

As the month draws to a close, we celebrate Ss Peter and Paul (29 June), the great pillars of the Church. Different in temperament and background, yet united in their love for Christ, they show us that God works through our weaknesses as well as our strengths.

Finally, on 30 June, we honour the First Martyrs of England, whose witness reminds us that the faith we profess today was handed on through sacrifice, perseverance, and grace.

As we walk with these saints through June, may we learn from their courage, kindness, and fidelity. May they help us to walk more attentively with Christ—loving more generously, trusting more deeply, and living our faith with quiet confidence each day.

June – The Month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus

Each year, the Church dedicates the month of June to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. This devotion invites us to reflect more deeply on the love of Christ — a love that is faithful, forgiving, and offered freely to all.

The image of the Heart of Jesus is rich in meaning. In everyday life, the heart is a sign of love and compassion, and so the Sacred Heart reminds us that Jesus loves not in an abstract way, but personally and tenderly. It points to the love shown throughout Jesus' life: welcoming the sinner, healing the sick, comforting the sorrowful, and ultimately giving his life on the Cross.

What the devotion means

Devotion to the Sacred Heart is not about focusing on an image for its own sake. Rather, it helps us to: Trust in the mercy of Jesus, especially when we feel weak or discouraged. Recognise God's patience and forgiveness, even when love is not returned. Grow in gratitude for Christ's sacrifice and presence in our lives.

The Heart of Jesus is often shown wounded and crowned with thorns. This reminds us that Christ's love is not sentimental or easy — it is a love that endures suffering and continues to offer mercy, even when rejected.

A call to respond

The Church encourages devotion to the Sacred Heart as a response to Christ's love. This response is lived out in simple but meaningful ways: Through prayer, especially before the Blessed Sacrament. Through receiving the Eucharist with reverence and thanksgiving. Through acts of charity, patience, and forgiveness in daily life.

In other words, devotion to the Sacred Heart is not only something we pray — it is something we live.

The Solemnity of the Sacred Heart

The Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus is celebrated each year on the Friday after Corpus Christi. It is followed by the Memorial of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, reminding us that .

Sr Anne was a wonderful addition to Our Lady and St Gerard's parish and many parishioners will remember her cycling every morning, whatever the weather, from Rose cottage in Bamber Bridge to St Gerard's. She became a great guide and friend to both Michael and I, a friendship which continued until her death in 2024.

After she left, Lostock Hall, we visited her in Denaby Main, Leeds, St Beuno's and finally in Whitby where she died.

Whilst in the parish she ran the sacramental programme which, in those days, was relatively new as Bishop Kelly of Salford had recently reordered the sacraments of initiation. This meant that the programme started in February the feast of the Presentation, closely followed at Pentecost when the children were Confirmed. . Reconciliation followed in Advent and then the following Easter our children made their first Holy Communion. In those days any parents who were available and a team of parish catechists delivered 8 full afternoon sessions in the parochial centre. Sr Anne, gathering together about 12-15 parents, provided informative afternoon training for them a week before the children's sessions.

The following week the catechists in the parochial centre were given small groups of children and delivered the training they'd received from Sr Anne. She would lead these sessions and could 'charm' the children. With her considerable teaching skills you could hear a pin drop during the prayer sessions.

She was also a great visitor of the sick and the elderly and was greatly appreciated by those who weren't able to get to church. Sr Anne also ran the baptism course and would visit all the parents requesting baptism. This would involve a considerable commitment as there were a fair number of baptisms in the early nineties. In fact she was one of the godmothers to our youngest son Thomas Louis. Thomas was baptised at the Easter vigil in 1993 alongside our eldest son Gerard who, with several other children, made his first holy Communion that night.

One of her most important contributions to parish life was the introduction of the RCIA programme which at that time involved more than a year long programme. Sr Anne designed and wrote the whole programme and every week participants interested in becoming Catholics, would be given copies of her extensive notes of the gospels, the sacraments and all aspects of the Catholic faith. Sponsors were also expected to attend, and I know there are parishioners, still very active in the parish, who became Catholics after attending one of her courses. I'm thinking particularly of Ann Quinlan, Karen Walton and Mary Mc Garry. Karen and Ann Quinlan's daughter Jane, of course are still running the sacramental programme!



She also led a contemplative prayer group where a small group of parishioners met every week to meditate silently, using a sacred word. This followed the centering prayer teaching of Thomas Keating. Older parishioners may remember some of the regular attendees: Josephine Catterall, Teresa Clayton and Connie Fleming, Neil Fleming's mum. I remember a weekend spent at the Bernardine Cistercian convent at Hynning Hall with Sr Anne who was one of the presenters. We meditated the weekend away!

Some parishioners may remember her running a course on the Enneagram, an ancient spirituality which has its origins in the East but can be helpful in assisting people become more aware of their personality type, their gifts and their shadow side.



She was also the parish marriage scrutineer. This involved her questioning people who may be eligible for an annulment.

There was a proscribed number of questions she would ask sensitively and afterwards she would decide if the person had a good case for annulment. She would then put forward these people to the diocesan annulment committee.

When my children were small, I attended several sessions of a parenting course run by Sr Anne and Sr Mary John at Brownedge. Both sisters helping parents of young children to be more effective. This course was published by the family caring trust based in Dublin. Later, sister Anne ran this course, at St Gerard's following this with the teen parenting course. The teen course, I found extremely useful as, at that time, I was attempting to negotiate the challenging role of parent to four teenage girls whilst also having several younger children. If anyone is old enough to have a tape recorder, I have all Sr Anne's tapes and programme guide which I will happily lend out!



In January 1993 she was travelling in Yorkshire with another sister when a car ploughed into the back of their car and Sr Anne was injured quite seriously. There was talk of her leaving the parish then but with her indomitable spirit she returned a few weeks later insisting she still had a job to complete at St Gerard's! After serving in the parish, she took on various leadership roles with the sisters of Mercy and then became a spiritual director at St Beuno's where she led 30-day retreats on St Ignatius' spiritual exercises.

A Table for the Nation

A Table for the Nation is a single, monumental table made from one extraordinary tree: a prehistoric Fenland black oak that lay preserved beneath the peat for over 5,000 years. Measuring more than thirteen metres in length, the table has been created as a shared civic object — not furniture for private ownership, but a place for gathering, conversation, reflection and ceremony.



The table invites people to sit together around a material that connects the present day with deep time. It speaks of community, stewardship and continuity, offering a physical space in which dialogue about our shared future can take place, grounded in the long environmental history of this land.

From May 2026, A Table for the Nation will be installed at Blackburn Cathedral, where it will remain on public display for one year, continuing its journey as a national object hosted within spaces of collective significance.

The Oak

The oak at the heart of the project comes from the ancient Fenland landscape — a forested environment that once covered vast areas of eastern England before being gradually submerged and preserved by water and peat. Over millennia, the timber darkened and hardened, becoming what is known as black oak: one of the rarest and most precious natural materials in Britain.

Rather than cutting the tree into smaller pieces, the project made the deliberate decision to preserve its full length. This approach honours the integrity of the oak as a living organism and allows its story to be read in the grain, scale and presence of the wood itself. The oak stands as a powerful reminder of the long relationship between people, land and climate — a witness to environmental change across thousands of years.

The Legacy

The Fenland Black Oak Project is about more than a single artefact. Its legacy lies in how we choose to value, preserve and share our natural and cultural heritage.

By transforming an ancient tree into a table for public use, the project creates opportunities for learning, dialogue and reflection across generations. Wherever it is hosted, the table becomes a focal point for conversation about sustainability, responsibility and our connection to the landscapes that sustain us.

Installed at Blackburn Cathedral from May 2026 to May 2027, the table will continue to fulfil its purpose as a living, evolving space — one that belongs not to an individual, but to the nation.

The Editor has seen it last year in Lincoln and again this year in Litchfield Cathedrals and it is an amazing table. You can spend a good hour or so reading all about it with the exhibition notes that will be displayed with it.

Lostock Hall St Gerard's FC- Once upon a Time Part 1

My earliest recollection of 'Lostock Hall St Gerard 's' football team was making the long trek to the team's soccer pitch down Wateringpool Lane to the 'Gasworks' ground.

Two looming gasometers overlooking the pitch was the local version of the 'twin towers of Wembley'! We had our own game of football behind the goals using the back of the goal nets as ours. The Church had quite a decent team in the 50's and reached the final on the hallowed turf (pre-plastic) of Deepdale, home of PNE, on a couple of occasions. Indeed, I plucked up the courage to ask the school's headmaster Mr (Herb) Brennan to borrow the school bell to take along to Deepdale and cheer on 'Gerard's' and it must have worked because they won it 2-1 against English Martyrs, didn't 'Flash' Watson score the winner?

This was in the days before health and safety went mad and a school bell wasn't an offensive weapon.

My brief moment of glory came at 'Tardy St Gerard's' Junior football team when I scored a first half hat-trick in a 4-1 win over local rivals 'Council School'. This was on the then School football pitch, now site of the junior School.

We were brought crashing to earth, courtesy of a 7-0 tonking from 'Brownedge St Marys' several weeks later, the 'Brig' star was a tall thin blonde-haired lad called John Hunter, who fortunately for me, played alongside each other for five years in various football teams at Preston Catholic College. I haven't seen him in over 60 years but there are several 'Hunters' in the Browndge area at this moment in time including a local councillor.

There were several families associated with 'Lostock Hall St Gerards FC' over the many years from the late 40's onwards, some providing multiple players: - Watsons, Jacksons, Swarbricks, Gormley's etc, If I have missed anyone out, please accept my apologies and get in touch..... to be continued
